Turkish Consulate General in Los Angeles: 2026 Services Guide

Passports, ID cards, birth and marriage registration, military service and powers of attorney. Booking steps and contact information.

SHORT ANSWER

Turkish citizens in Los Angeles, and across California, handle their consular business at the Turkish Consulate General, which is actually located in Beverly Hills: 8500 Wilshire Blvd, Suite 900, Beverly Hills, CA 90211, +1-424-313-8800. In-person services run weekdays 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., and each service needs its own appointment on konsolosluk.gov.tr. Its jurisdiction covers not just California but 11 other western states as well.

Passports

In person and by appointment only; no mail applications. Bring your Turkish ID card, your old passport and one biometric photo. Fees are set centrally and change from time to time; check the consulate's own information page for the current 2026 fee schedule.

Turkish ID card

In person, by appointment. If you married in the U.S., the marriage must be registered before a new ID card application.

Registering a U.S.-born child (birth registration)

DOCUMENT	NOTES
☐ Application form	From the consulate information note
☐ Original birth certificate and a copy	Parents' names must match Turkish records. Available from the LA County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (lavote.gov) or LA County Public Health Vital Records.
☐ Parents' IDs	Turkish ID card or passport
☐ Marriage certificate	If applicable
☐ Multiple citizenship form	Because the child is a U.S. citizen
☐ Translation	Translation of the birth certificate if one parent is not Turkish

Marriage registration

A marriage license comes from the LA County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk at any of its 7 branch offices: a public license is \$91, a confidential license \$85, with no waiting period and a license valid for 90 days. You then register the U.S. marriage with the consulate by appointment. Before you apply, check the consulate's information notes for whether it can be done by mail, the current document list and fees.

Military service

- **Registration (yoklama):** men born in 2007 and others without a deferral must register by December 31, 2026, through the consulate or e-Devlet.
- **Paid military service (dövizle askerlik), July 1 to December 31, 2026:** the foreign-currency equivalent of 472,653.60 TL, collected in U.S. dollars at the Central Bank rate of the payment day. Ask the consulate about any transfer fee and the payment method before your appointment. The amount changes on January 1, 2027.
- **Requirements:** working in the U.S. with residence or work authorization, at least 3 years (1,095 days) of work abroad excluding time in Türkiye, completing the online training at dovizle.msb.gov.tr, and living in

the consulate's district. In person, by appointment.

- **Dual citizens:** those born in the U.S. or who came before age 18 can defer until the end of age 35, after registering their U.S. citizenship with the Turkish civil registry.
- **F-1 students:** deferral is handled through an education attaché; ask the consulate which one serves you.

Powers of attorney

In person, by appointment, and only at the consulate building. Bring the application form, your Turkish ID card, and the agent's name, Turkish ID number and date of birth. Some transactions require a photo. Fees vary by subject and length; ask the consulate for current amounts.

VISITING THE CONSULATE

- In-person services run in the morning only. The consulate is in an office building on Wilshire Boulevard, so leave time for building security and parking.
- Avoid booking on official holidays; check the consulate's site for the current 2026 holiday calendar.

NOT THE SAME AS U.S. IMMIGRATION

The consulate handles Turkish matters. U.S. visas, green cards and naturalization are handled by USCIS and the U.S. Department of State. If a green card application is pending, check your advance parole status before traveling to Türkiye.
